#### **Course Outcomes:**

Semester: IV

At the end of this course, the learner will be able to:

- Explore and identify the probable areas of research through review of literature, observation or experience
- Demonstrate research design in the research topic under consideration
- Evaluate the various statistical techniques suitable for analyzing data collected with reference to the respective research topic
- Develop an ability to present research findings through publication and project work and contribute to the existing pool of research
- Realize the significance of ethics and morality in conducting and presenting research findings through referencing and citations

#### Guidelines:

There will be a project work carrying 100 marks for internal students only. The students will have to select a subject from any area of the syllabi for Advanced Accountancy. The students will have to work under the guidance of concerned subject teacher. The project will carry total 100 marks out of which sixty marks will be allotted for Project Report and 40 marks will be allotted for Project Viva Voce to be conducted by internal teacher and external teacher (examiner) appointed by the competent authority.

### The following Time Frame should be adhered to by every student: Part I:

- A student can select any topic relating to principles, practices and procedures of Accounting, Auditing, Taxation and Management Accounting (a tentative list of the topics is enclosed for Project Work in accountancy). Any topic from the syllabus of the papers studied at M. Com Part One or Part Two under special paper Accountancy and Taxation can be used. Pick up any unit studied and try to connect it to the commercial world around e.g. in taxation a student has studied taxation of a company, then he can select a topic on Tax Planning of a particular company or a study of taxation of an educational institute.
- Students shall submit a Proposal for dissertation (guidelines will be provided by the guide) for approval of the topic for research by First week of January to the guide assigned to the student by the Department.
- Students will have to give a presentation of the proposal by the third week of January to the guide.
- To assess the progress of the students regarding their Research Project a presentation will be organised during the first week of March.
- A Student shall submit a dissertation of minimum 6000-8000 words and

maximum 10,000 words in two copies to the Head of the Department on or before 30<sup>th</sup> March.

- The dissertation shall be prepared under the guidance of an internal postgraduate recognized teacher as the internal supervisor.

**Part II**: An internal supervisor shall assess each dissertation for out of 60 marks, based on the methodology, analysis, contents and quality of the dissertation.

#### Part III:

A viva voce examination of each candidate shall be held where the student will have to make a presentation of the dissertation and defend the research. A panel of two referees shall be formed with one internal and one external examiner.

The viva voce shall carry 40 marks. Internal and external examiners shall give out of 20 marks each. The copies of dissertation and the record of the viva voce examination shall be maintained by the centre for two more academic years for inspection. The Marks obtained for project work shall be included in the statement of marks of all the regular internal students.

Note: To achieve the of ethical research by making an original contribution to the research pool, Dissertation of the candidate will undergo a check for Originality (check for Plagiarism). As per UGC Guidelines, the similarity score should be less than 10 percent. The student under the guidance of the supervisor should follow research ethics and makes all attempts to present original research.

IMP: The Dissertation would not be accepted if the similarity score is above 10 percent.
